The angels do not only have to be white! You can explore the entire color pallet with this Christmas decoration.

PRECIOSA Rocailles (**R**12) 331 19 001; 12/0; 78102 (55x)

PRECIOSA Rocailles (**R**9) 331 19 001; 9/0; 78102 (7x)

PRECIOSA drops (**D**8) 331 11 001; 8/0; 58205 (9x)

Fire polished beads (**FPB**3) 151 19 001; 3 mm; 00030/28701 (6x)

Fire polished beads (**FPB**5) 151 19 001; 5 mm; 02010/21402 (4x)

Fire polished beads (**FPB**6) 151 19 001; 6 mm; 00030/84110 (3x)

Imitation pearls (**IP**8) 131 19 001; 8 mm; 70402 (1x)

a stringing needle, scissors, a 0.20 mm line, a head pin (35 mm), needle nose and snipping pliers

Procedure:

The body Step 1:

String 3x **R**9 onto a 70 cm long line and thread the line through them twice in a circle.



Step 2:

String 1x **FPB**3, 1x **FPB**5 and 1x **FPB**3 and thread the line through the second and third



Step 3:


Step 4:

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String 1x **FPB**3 and 1x **FPB**5 and thread the line through the **FPB**3 from Step 2, the second and third **R**9 from Step 1 and the next **FPB**3.



String 1x **FPB**5 and thread the line through the **FPB**3, the R9 and the **FPB**3. Finish in the same **FPB**5 where you started.



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Step 5:

Step 6:

String 1x **D**8 and thread the line through the **FPB**5 from Step 4. Repeat until the end of the row.




String 1x **FPB6**, 1x **FPB3** and 1x **FPB6** and thread the line through the **FPB5** where you started one more time and then thread the line through the **D8** and **FPB5** from Step 5. String another 1x **FPB6** and 1x **FPB3** and thread the line through the **FPB6** from this step and the **FPB5** from Step 5. Thread the line through the **D8** and **FPB4** from Step 5 and the **FPB6** from this step. String 1x **FPB3** and thread the line through the **FPB6** from this step and the **FPB5** from Step 5 and theread the line through the **FPB6** from this step and the **FPB5** from Step 5 and then once again through the **D8** and **FPB5** from Step 5.



Step 7:


Continue sewing. The stitch should end in the **FPB**3 from Step 6. String 1x **D**8 and thread the line through the **FPB**5 from Step 4. Repeat until the end of the row.




Step 8:

The illustration shows the procedure from the side. String $4x \ R12$, $1x \ D8$ and $4x \ R12$ and pass the line through the adjacent D8. String a further $4x \ R12$, $1x \ D8$ and $4x \ R12$ and thread the line through the adjacent D8. Repeat to the next **D**8. Repeat again to the end of the row.


Secure the line - sew it in and cut it.





The wings

String 1x **FPB**5, 1x **R**12, 3x **Th** and 1x **R**12 on a 30 cm long line and close it in a circle. String 1x **R**12, 3x **Th** and 1x **R**12 and thread the line through the **FPB**5 several times and cut it off. Sew it in and cut it off.



Assembly

String 1x **R**12, the body, 1x **R**12, the wings, 1x **R**12 and 1x **IP**8 onto the head pin. Shorten the head pin as needed using the snipping pliers and create a loop with the needle nose pliers. The angel is finished.
